

1. Summary of GADCS-related Finalized Changes in the CY 2024 PFS Final Rule

Timeline for finalized CY 2024 changes



Addressing partial-year responses

Currently:

 Section 2, Question 1: Is [pre-populate number] an NPI your organization used to bill Medicare for ground ambulance services during the data collection period? Yes / No

CY 2024 PFS Final Rule Change:

- Split the existing "Yes" response into two separate responses:
 - "Yes, throughout the organization's continuous, 12-month data collection period."
 - "Yes, but for only part of the organization's continuous, 12-month data collection period."
 - "No" response will remain as-is.

Programming logic for hospitals and other Medicare providers of services

Currently:

- NPIs that indicate "yes" to any of the following questions in Section 2 (Organizational Characteristics) will see questions in Section 7 (Labor Costs) about fire, police or public safety labor costs
 - Question 7: Fire department-based, police or other public safety department-based <u>OR</u>
 - Question 8: Shared some or all costs <u>OR</u>
 - Question 9 = fire, police, or other public safety department

CY 2024 PFS Final Rule Change:


- Only NPIs that report "yes" to <u>ALL</u> the fire, police or other public safety options in Section 2 will see questions in Section 7 (Labor) about fire, police or public safety labor costs.
- Ensures hospital-based NPIs will <u>NOT</u> see questions about fire, police or other public safety in later sections of the GADCS.

Other finalized editorial changes and technical corrections

- Updating Section 2, Question 3 (organization name) in the printable instrument so that it aligns with the functionality now in the web-based GADCS.
- Section 9.1 and Section 9.2, Question 5:
 - Update fixes incorrect language about acquisition costs and annual depreciation
 - Current: "Do not report ground ambulance acquisition costs related to an annual depreciation expense"
 - Changed: "Do not report an acquisition cost and an annual depreciation expense for the same ground ambulance."
- Correcting typos that do not affect the meaning of questions (e.g., punctuation correction).

Question	Answer
1. Why is CMS collecting this data?	1. CMS is required by statute to collect this data. It will be analyzed by MedPAC to inform recommendations on Medicare payment rates for ground ambulance services.
2. Has my organization been selected to participate?	2. Lists of selected organizations are at the website above. Year 1 and 2 organizations have already begun to collect and report data. Most Year 3 and 4 organizations are collecting data now and will report data starting in 2024.
3. Is participation required?	3. Yes. Organizations that do not sufficiently submit data will receive a 10% Medicare Part B payment reduction.
4. When will we need to collect and report data?	4. The FAQ at the website above includes examples. Organizations <i>collect</i> data over a 12-month period and have 5 months to <i>report</i> data after the data collection period has ended.
5. How do I inform CMS of our data collection start date?	5. Report or revise your initial information, including your data collection period start date and contact information, at Palmetto GBA's website: https://www.palmettogba.com/palmetto/gambulance.nsf/ . All Year 1 through 4 organizations should have done this by now: If your organization hasn't, please do so immediately.
6. How do we report data?	6. All selected organizations must submit data via CMS's web-based GADCS portal.
