Money Follows the Person (MFP) Rebalancing Demonstration

Section 6071 of the Deficit Reduction Act of 2005 (P.L. 109-171) created the MFP rebalancing demonstration, the largest demonstration program in the history of Medicaid. It provides \$1.75 billion in funding to the Secretary to make awards to states to achieve the following objectives with respect to institutional and home and community-based long-term care services under State Medicaid programs.

PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

- 1. **Rebalancing** Increase the use of home and community-based, rather than institutional, long-term care services.
- 2. **Money Follows the Person** Eliminate barriers or mechanisms, whether in the State law, the State Medicaid plan, the State budget, or otherwise, that prevent or restrict the flexible use of Medicaid funds to enable Medicaid-eligible individuals to receive support for appropriate and necessary long-term services in the settings of their choice.
- 3. **Continuity of Service** Increase the ability of the State Medicaid program to assure continued provision of home and community-based long-term care services to eligible individuals who choose to transition from an institutional to a community setting.
- 4. **Quality Assurance and Quality Improvement** Ensure that procedures are in place (at least comparable to those required under the qualified HCB program) to provide quality assurance for eligible individuals receiving Medicaid home and community-based long-term care services and to provide for continuous quality improvement in such services.

The demonstration provides for enhanced federal medical assistance percentage (FMAP) for 12 months for each person who meets a minimum duration of institutional living and is transitioned from the institution to the community during the demonstration period. Additionally, the State must continue to provide community services after the 12 month period for as long as the person needs community services and is Medicaid eligible.

CURRENT STATUS

CMS has awarded \$1,435,709,479 in grants to 31 States and the award summaries are provided below. With these funds, States propose to transition 37,731 individuals out of institutional settings over the five-year demonstration period.

On January 11, 2007, CMS awarded \$888,625,631 in MFP grants to 17 States (Phase I) with States proposing to transition 23,604 individuals. On May 14, an additional 14 States (Phase II) received MFP grant awards totaling \$547,083,848, with those States planning to transition a total of 14,127 individuals.

Individual awards in 2007 may seem low in comparison to the 5 year commitment amount. This is, in part, due to the requirement that States submit operational protocols to CMS before delivering services under this demonstration. Most States anticipate that completing the demonstration planning and operational protocol will take the first 12 months of the demonstration, and that they will not begin transitions until the second year of the demonstration program. Subsequent year awards will contain substantially more funding for services to beneficiaries.
