

### **RECOMMENDED PROCEDURES**

- **Identify persons eligible for vaccination based on their age, their vaccination status, or the presence of a medical condition that puts them at high risk**
- **Provide adequate information to patients or their guardians regarding the risks from and benefits of a vaccine and documenting the delivery of that information.**
- **Record patient refusals or medical contraindications.**
- **Record administration of a vaccine(s) and any post-vaccination adverse events.**
- **Provide documentation of vaccine administration to patients and their primary-care providers.**
