

Alabama

The Medicare Modernization Act of 2003 (MMA) provides an opportunity for Medicare beneficiaries in the State of Alabama to enroll in a Medicare-approved prescription drug discount card to help lower their drug costs. Beginning this June, the Medicare Prescription Drug Discount Card Program will enable Medicare beneficiaries to save discounts of 10 to 15 percent on average for their prescription drugs, and as much as 25 percent or more on individual prescriptions. In addition, the MMA enacted the Transitional Assistance Program, which provides a \$600 credit per year in 2004 and 2005 for the purchase of prescription drugs to beneficiaries with incomes that are 135 percent (or below) the federal poverty level, provided that individuals do not have Medicaid or other drug coverage.

Here's how this program is helping Alabama:

- Currently, there are over 40 million Medicare beneficiaries nationally, including 720,000 beneficiaries in Alabama. Of those in Alabama, 195,000 beneficiaries do not have any prescription drug coverage. This program primarily benefits these individuals by assisting them in paying for the drugs they need.
- Over the duration of the program, CMS estimates a potential for \$3.8 to \$5.1 billion in total beneficiary savings from discounted drug prices nationally.
- CMS expects that a total of 7 million Medicare beneficiaries, including 169,000 beneficiaries in Alabama, are currently eligible to participate in the Transitional Assistance Program. Over the duration of the program, this translates into a potential savings of \$8.6 billion nationally and \$203 million for beneficiaries in Alabama.
- Nationally, CMS expects 65 percent of eligible (low-income) beneficiaries to participate in the Transitional Assistance Program. This means that a total of close to 5 million beneficiaries are estimated to participate, including 110,000 in Alabama. Based on this assumption, these beneficiaries are expected to save a total of \$5 billion nationally and \$132 million in Alabama over the duration of the program.

Over the duration of the program, this translates into a potential savings of \$8.6 billion nationally and \$10 million for beneficiaries in Alaska.
- Nationally, CMS expects 65 percent of eligible (low-income) beneficiaries to participate in the Transitional Assistance Program. This means that a total of close to 5 million beneficiaries are estimated to participate, including 5,000 in Alaska. Based on this assumption, these beneficiaries are expected to save a total of \$5 billion nationally and \$6 million in Alaska over the duration of the program.

Wisconsin

The Medicare Modernization Act of 2003 (MMA) provides an opportunity for Medicare beneficiaries in the State of Wisconsin to enroll in a Medicare-approved prescription drug discount card to help lower their drug costs. Beginning this June, the Medicare Prescription Drug Discount Card Program will enable Medicare beneficiaries to save discounts of 10 to 15 percent on average for their prescription drugs, and as much as 25 percent or more on individual prescriptions. In addition, the MMA enacted the Transitional Assistance Program, which provides a \$600 credit per year in 2004 and 2005 for the purchase of prescription drugs to beneficiaries with incomes that are 135 percent (or below) the federal poverty level, provided that individuals do not have Medicaid or other drug coverage.

Here's how this program is helping Wisconsin:

- Currently, there are over 40 million Medicare beneficiaries nationally, including 806,000 beneficiaries in Wisconsin. Of those in Wisconsin, 234,000 beneficiaries do not have any prescription drug coverage. This program primarily benefits these individuals by assisting them in paying for the drugs they need.
- Over the duration of the program, CMS estimates a potential for \$3.8 to \$5.1 billion in total beneficiary savings from discounted drug prices nationally.
- CMS expects that a total of 7 million Medicare beneficiaries, including 70,000 beneficiaries in Wisconsin, are currently eligible to participate in the Transitional Assistance Program. Over the duration of the program, this translates into a potential savings of \$8.6 billion nationally and \$84 million for beneficiaries in Wisconsin.
- Nationally, CMS expects 65 percent of eligible (low-income) beneficiaries to participate in the Transitional Assistance Program. This means that a total of close to 5 million beneficiaries are estimated to participate, including 46,000 in Wisconsin. Based on this assumption, these beneficiaries are expected to save a total of \$5 billion nationally and \$55 million in Wisconsin over the duration of the program.

Wisconsin has a combined total of 42 individual drug cards (excluding special endorsements). This includes 39 national drug cards, 1 regional card(s), and 2 Medicare Advantage exclusive card(s). See attachment for more information.

In addition, some States have other pharmacy programs that offer a prescription drug benefit. Wisconsin's program is entitled, "Senior Care (above 200%)," which has close to 21,000 enrollees. Wisconsin spends about \$12 million per year on this program.
