The following are amendments to the Title XXI State Plan submitted in June 1998:

Section 4.1.8

AHCCCS is requesting permission to continue Title XXI eligibility for an individual who is eligible for Title XXI and who turns 19 years during an inpatient hospitalization. Eligibility would terminate on the date of discharge from the hospital.

Section 6.2.7

Add over the counter drugs.

Section 6.2.20

Add case management services for children who need behavioral health services and who receive those services through a Regional Behavioral Health Authority (RHBA), Tribal RHBA, the Indian Health Services or a 638 Tribal Facility.
