

## **States Selected for Payment Error Rate Measurement (PERM) Medicaid and SCHIP Improper Payments Measurement**

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) developed a 17-state three year rotational approach to review the states under PERM. CMS's State selection process allows States to plan for the reviews as each State will be selected once and only once every 3 years for Medicaid and SCHIP. Following are the States CMS selected to measure improper payments in the most recent three-year rotation.

### **The following States are selected for PERM measurement in Fiscal Year (FY) 2007:**

Alabama, California, Colorado, Georgia, Kentucky, Maryland, Massachusetts, Nebraska, New Hampshire, New Jersey, North Carolina, South Carolina, Rhode Island, Tennessee, Utah, Vermont, and West Virginia.

### **The following States are selected for PERM measurement in Fiscal Year (FY) 2008:**

Alaska, Arizona, District of Columbia, Florida, Hawaii, Indiana, Iowa, Louisiana, Maine, Mississippi, Montana, New York, Nevada, Oregon, South Dakota, Texas, and Washington.

### **The following States are selected for PERM measurement in Fiscal Year (FY) 2009:**

Arkansas, Connecticut, Delaware, Idaho, Illinois, Kansas, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, New Mexico, North Dakota, Ohio, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, Virginia, Wyoming, and Wisconsin.
