#### I. GENERAL INFORMATION

**A.** Background: This document furnishes you with the CY 2009 ambulance inflation factor (AIF) for determining the payment limit for ambulance services required by section 1834(l)(3)(B) of the Social Security Act (the Act).

Section 1834(l) (3) (B) of the Act provides the basis for updating payment limits for ambulance services. Specifically, this section provides for an update in payments for 2009 that is equal to the percentage increase in the consumer price index for all urban consumers (CPI-U), for the 12-month period ending with June of the previous year. The resulting percentage is referred to as the AIF.

The national fee schedule for ambulance services has been phased in over a five-year transition period beginning April 1, 2002. The Medicare Prescription Drug, Improvement and Modernization Act of 2003 (MMA) also established that for ambulance services furnished during the period July 1, 2004 through December 31, 2009, the ground ambulance base rate is subject to a floor amount, which is determined by establishing nine fee schedules based on each of the nine census divisions, and using the same methodology as was used to establish the national fee schedule. If the regional fee schedule methodology for a given census division results in an amount that is lower than the national ground base rate, then it is not used, and the national fee schedule amount applies for all providers and suppliers in the census division. If the regional fee schedule methodology for a given census division results in an amount that is greater than the national ground base rate, then the fee schedule portion of the base rate for that census division is equal to a blend of the national rate and the regional rate. For CY 2009, this blend would be 20 percent regional ground base rate and 80 percent national ground base rate. As of January 1, 2009, the total payment amount for ground ambulance providers and suppliers is based on either 100 percent of the national ambulance fee schedule or 80 percent of the national ambulance fee schedule and 20 percent of the regional ambulance fee schedule, whichever is greater.

In addition, Section 414 of the Medicare Modernization Act (MMA) added section 1843 (1) (11) of the Act which provides that, in the case of ground ambulance services furnished on or after July 1, 2004, and before January 1, 2009, regardless of where the transportation originates, the fee schedule established under this section shall provide that, with respect to the payment rate for mileage for a trip above 50 miles the per mile rate other wise established shall increase by 25 percent of the payment per mile otherwise applicable to miles in excess of 50 miles in such a trip. This provision will sunset on December 31, 2008. Effective for dates of service of January 1, 2009 and later, services paid under the ambulance fee schedule shall not include this temporary increase. This temporary increase and the date of applicability is outlined in the July 1, 2004 Federal Register (Vol. 69, No. 126, Page 40289).

**B. Policy:** This transmittal manualizes the AIF so that Medicare contractors can accurately determine payment amounts for ambulance services.

The AIF for calendar year 2009 is 5.0 percent. Part B coinsurance and deductible requirements apply. The 2009 ambulance fee schedule file is available upon publication of the change request (CR). It may be retrieved at any time and will reside indefinitely for your access. It may be updated with each quarterly Common Working File (CWF) update.

Effective dates of service of January 1, 2009, and later, services paid under the ambulance fee schedule shall not reflect the temporary bonus payment for long ambulance transports.

As of January 1, 2009, the total payment amount for ground ambulance providers and suppliers will be based on either 100 percent of the national ambulance fee schedule or 80 percent of the national ambulance fee schedule, and 20 percent of the regional ambulance fee schedule, whichever is greater.

The AIF for calendar year 2009 is 5.0 percent. Part B coinsurance and deductible requirements apply. The 2009 ambulance fee schedule file is available upon publication of the Change Request (CR). It may be retrieved at any time and will reside indefinitely for your access. It may be updated with each quarterly Common Working File (CWF) update.
